Iris de Rode earned her doctorate in 2019 from Université de Paris VIII. Her dissertation on François-Jean de Chastellux won the prestigious Prix Guizot from the Académie Française. Currently, she is preparing a new book "En route to Yorktown" slated for publication by the University of Virginia Press in 2025. Since 2013, Iris has taught American and Transatlantic history at SciencesPo Paris and is deeply involved in public history initiatives with organizations like the National Park Service and the French Embassy in Washington DC. She is also a US committee member of "america2026.eu".
